Port Emergency Alarm

The Port emergency alarm is an oscillating siren. This alarm is tested every Wednesday at 1130 hrs. Crewmembers must proceed back to their vessels immediately. VHF Channel 12 must be monitored for instructions from "New Plymouth Harbour Radio". Stop all cargo operations. Engines should be placed on standby.

Emergency on Ship

Sound one or more blasts on the ships whistle, each blast must not be less than 10 seconds duration supplemented by the continuous sounding of the general alarm.

Call "New Plymouth Harbour Radio on VHF Channel 12 or 16 and advise nature of emergency.

Advise PFSO of nature of emergency or increase in security level.

Pre- arrival information required from vessels

The following information shall be sent to from the vessel to Port Taranaki Security 24 hours prior to arrival via the ship's agent. This can follow a free format

- **Vessels name** and **IMO** number
- Vessels International Ship Security Certificate (**ISSC**) number.
- The current security level of the vessel
- The current crew list
- Notification of crew changes expected at Port Taranaki
- Expected visitors / contractors
- Stores / Spares expected to be loaded to the vessel
- Any special security requirements

Declaration of Security (DoS)

A **DoS** shall be required under the following conditions:

- When the **Maritime New Zealand**, the **PFSO** or ship deem it is required
- When the Administration for a ship entitled to fly its flag requests it
- When either the ship or the port is at any security level other than one
- When there is a particular security concern at the ship / shore interface, such as embarking and disembarking of passengers or handling of dangerous goods that pose a new security threat
- When the port feels there is a security threat from any of the ports visited by the ship in the past
- When a ship calls at the Newton King Tanker Terminal

Should an approaching vessel indicate a higher security level than the port, the **PFSO** will liaise with the **SSO / Master** to discuss the specific security arrangements prior to the vessel's entry in the port. **Maritime New Zealand** shall be advised of these arrangements.

At security level one, ships that regularly call at Port Taranaki may function with a continuing **DoS** for multiple visits, provided that the declaration is for a specific security level.

A subsequent change in the Security Level shall require revised DoS to be completed.

Entry and Exit Requirements at Port Taranaki

All seafarers must carry with them at all times, Acceptable identification. This can be:

- A valid passport
- Seafarers identity documents issued by a contracting government or flag state Administration
- An identification credential issued by a recognised company, union or trade association

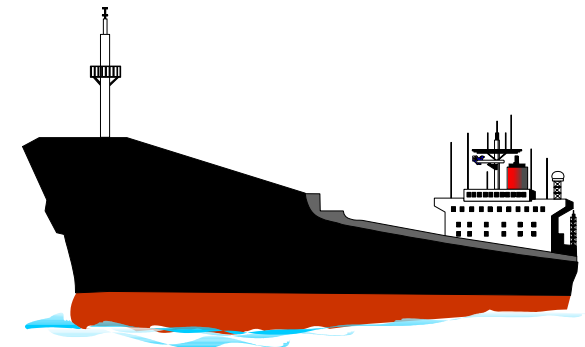
Vessels berthed alongside the **Newton King Tanker Terminal** will be issued with access cards and all crew **shall** use them to get in and out of the **Newton King Tanker Terminal**.

Persons wishing to leave the port from any other berth must make their way to the Main Gate on Breakwater Road. The identity of the seafarer will be checked against the ship's crew list held in the Gatehouse. If the Main Gatehouse is unmanned you are required to push the call button on the intercom to alert the on duty Security Officer in the Watchhouse. You are required to remain there until you have been attended and cleared by the on duty Security Officer.

NOTE: Any firearm or weapon carried onboard any vessel shall remain on the vessel.

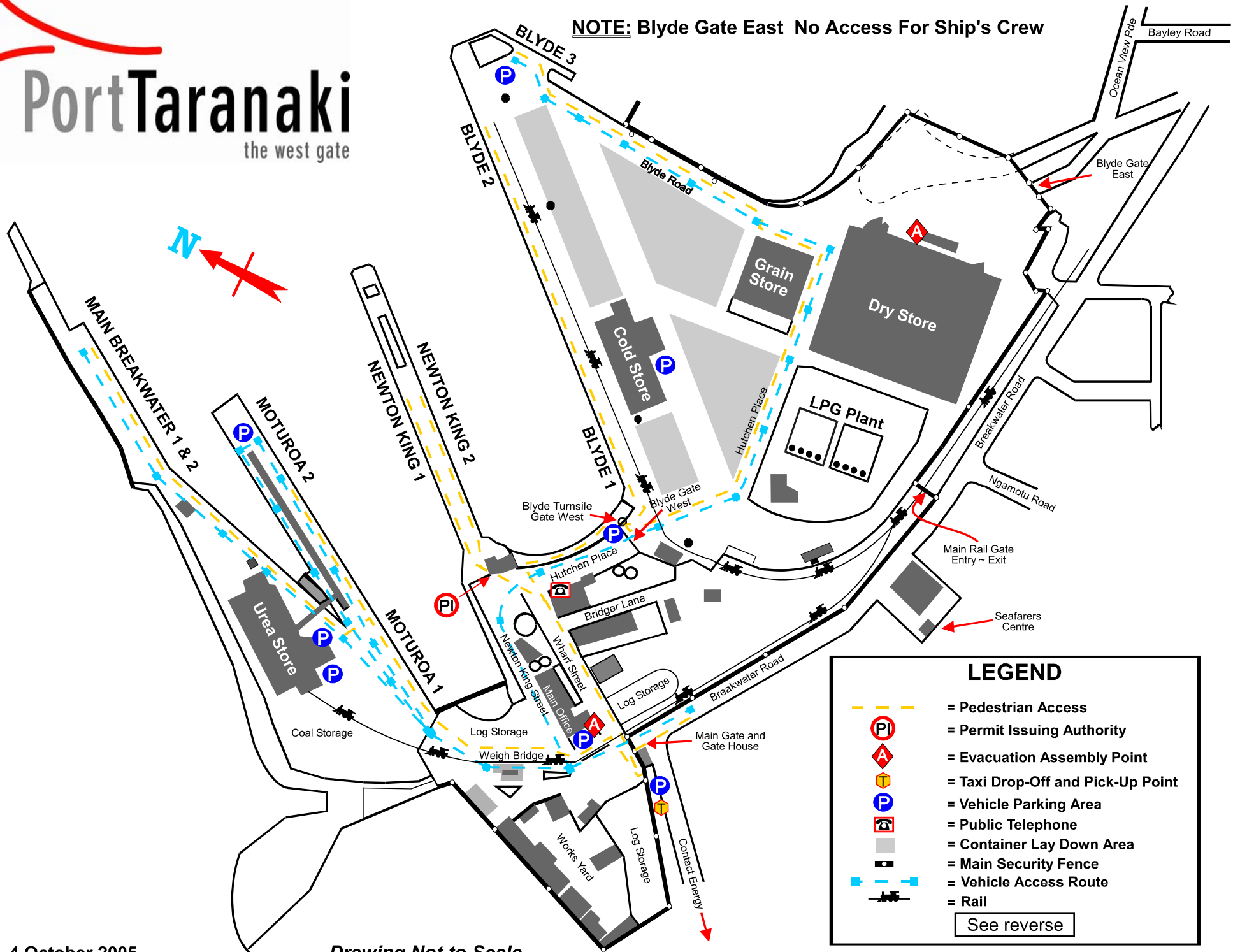
No firearm or weapon shall be brought ashore; it is illegal to do so under New Zealand Law. Doing so will result in prosecution of the offender.
